Annual Meeting Part II Sunday, Feb.7th Following Worship



As a non-profit organization, we are required to have an Annual Meeting for legal purposes. Our Annual Meeting is broken into two pieces, one part is held in December and another occurs in January. *A meeting was held on Jan. 17th but the sound system was not working.* The first

meeting allows us to take care of approving a budget for the following year and electing church officers. "Staying Together"

The pandemic has changed so many aspects of life, including how we "do church". It is likely that the first half of 2021 will look at lot like 2020., although there should be more of a sense of a "light at the end of the tunnel" as many people are vaccinated. In 2020, pastors and other church leaders had to go into "triage mode". The goal was to keep the most important and most basic things going. Pastor Joel and the staff did that by providing multiple opportunities for worship, ways to check-in on-line and daily reflections. Those will continue into 2021 and the methods of delivery will likely adjust over time. At the same time, there is a second key component and that is around the topic of connecting. While it is good to get "worship out to you", it is not the same as "being together as a community". During this year, Pastor Joel will be working with the Elders to think about how we can keep relationships vibrant. One such opportunity in January will be our virtual trivia night. You and your family can log into Zoom and test your knowledge and laugh with one another. 
