A motion was moved by Nancy Salyer and seconded by Eileen Chappell to approve the February Minutes and April Minutes. One change Nancy Salyer was to contact family to offer assistance. Motion carried.

Joyce Jaycox moved a motion and seconded by Deb Honaker to approve the April Treasurer's Report. Motion carried.

Deacon's Report: Did not meet. Sue reported that currently we have around \$1700 for the Leapin' Outreach project.

Elder's Report: Met before the Consistory Meeting. Reviewed Sunday Morning Worship protocols.





#### May is National Mental Health Awareness Month

- Approximately 1 in 5 adults in the U.S.—43.8 million or 18.5% experience mental illness in a given year.
- Each day an estimated 18-22 veterans die by suicide.
- Suicide is the second leading caused of death among 15-29 year-olds.
- 7.1% of children aged 3-17 years or 4.4. million have been diagnosed with anxiety.
- Depression is more common that AIDS, cancer and diabetes combined.
- 50% of mental health disorders begin before age 14 and 75% before age 24.
- 56% of American adults with a mental illness do not receive treatment.
- Many conditions may coexist with depression. Depression may increase the risk for another illness, and dealing with an illness may lead
  to depression.
- More than 300 million people of all ages suffer from depression world wide.
